The 2010 Spring & Summer Schedule



The Junior Program: A two-week program designed to teach your kids about the joys of sailing and boating. Kids will take part in sailing small boat, kayak, and keel boat either morning or afternoons. If your son or daughter would like to sail, be a passenger or paddle their way around the Sound, odds are, we've got the boat for them. Sessions run 8:30 AM to 12:30PM or 1PM to 5PM. Students will be placed in classes based upon age, skill level and interest. We do not provide transportation or lunch and are not a full day program, but we may be able to find a spot for your child in one of our partner organizations so that they may have the full day experience.

The After School Maritime Explorers

Program: A 16-week program designed to teach your kids about the joys of sailing, boating and Long Island Sound. Kids ages 10-16 will sail small boats, big boats, build a wooden boat and create a saltwater aquarium with creatures collected from Long Island Sound.

Location: The CCB Eco-Classroom

Starts Wednesday March 3 and runs weekly until June 16, 3PM to 5PM.

Weather dependent, the afterschool program may be cancelled due to weather concerns at any time. There will be no refunds due to weather cancellations or for any other reason. The CCB Staff reserves the right to offer scholarships based on need, desire and residency.

Cost: \$200/season (Note: Camperships available for those who qualify)



The 2010 Learn to Swim Campaign

(Note: Connecticut State Law mandates that anyone wishing to operate any motorized vessel or sailing vessel over 19 feet requires a Connecticut Safe Boating Certificate. Accordingly, please attach a copy of your safe boating certificate with your registration for the Power Boating or Keel Boat classes. If you do not have a certificate, we can assist you in obtaining your certificate prior to start of your class.)
